### **BACKGROUND**

- The organisation is seeking registration with a primary focus on delivering to international students. During the initial registration audit the organisation was audited against the requirements of the National Vocational Education and Training Regulator Act 2011 and the Education Services for Overseas Students Act 2000 (ESOS Act), including the requirements of the National Code of Practice for Registration Authorities and Providers of Education and Training to Overseas Students 2007 (the National Code) and the ELICOS National Standards.
- In between submitting the initial registration application and the audit the organisation secured a new premise at 64 Logan Road, Woolloongabba. The organisation will operate from this location only and has identified the majority of delivery of training and/or assessment services to be conducted from this location in Queensland.
- The organisational structure includes Jack Murray Chief Executive Officer, Dan Murray Chief

Financial Officer and two contract trainers and assessors.

- The organisation is not seeking to:
  - deliver to students under 18
  - collect fees of more than \$1,500
  - enter into arrangements with other providers or organisation for the delivery of training and/or assessment
  - offer work-based training or assessment.
- The organisation will consider entering into arrangements with education agents however, at the time of the audit this had not occurred.
- Training will be conducted face to face at the organisation premises
